Scholarships

Scholarship Committee members met this month to review developments in the AAUW SH Scholarship Program, and the Committee is happy to announce that AAUW SH will award thirteen scholarships in June 2024!

According to Committee Chair Teresa Gibbons, "We have enough money in the budget to provide our usual four scholarships: two Pathfinder awards and one Luminary award to SHHS seniors, and to support non-traditional students, we will award \$1500 to InterCare to help cover transportation expenses for the apprentices in the medical assistant program." In addition, thanks to a record-setting August book sale, an additional children's book sale in May, an internal fundraising campaign, and the Cogdal Winery benefit concert, nine Achievement Awards will be also given: all previous AAUW SH scholarship recipients will receive a \$1500 scholarship check for their next year of college, provided they have a minimum 2.7 GPA at the end of the 2024 Winter semester.

Teresa also informed Committee members that she spoke with Tiffany Greenman, daughter of long-time AAUW SH member **Barb Konrad**. Barb passed away earlier this month, and members will remember her as an active member who attended and supported many AAUW events. In particular, Barb was a dedicated book sorter and worked as a cashier during many book sales. Tiffany said that her mom spoke often about AAUW, and about the Scholarship Program specifically. To honor Barb's

dedication to our organization, her family designated the AAUW SH Scholarship Program as a preferred memorial. So far, enough money has been donated to fund one of our



existing scholarships in 2024 which will be named for Barb. If you would like to donate to this fund, please write *scholarship fund* in the memo of your check, and mail it to: AAUW SH PO Box 343 South Haven, MI 49090

Teresa also reported that SHHS seniors will soon begin applying for all South Haven area scholarships using the Common Application again this year. Since using this online tool, all of the local scholarship providers saw an increase in applicants. In addition to the Common App, AAUW South Haven's Scholarship Committee has continued to work on improving our scholarship program, and committee member Pat Stephenson is a key part of that. Pat is a financial aid expert, and she explained to Committee members how colleges are supposed to apply scholarships like ours to a student's financial aid. To ensure that our scholarship money goes directly to the student and is not used to off-set the college's financial aid package, Pat drafted a letter explaining exactly how our scholarship money can be used. This letter will be sent to all of our scholarship recipients and to the financial aid departments of the colleges they attend.

Lastly, Co-chairs **Sharon Guiltinan and Jean Bevevino** have begun planning for the Spring
Scholarship Celebration which will be held in early
June. Stay tuned for more details!

Did you know that October is LGBTQ+ History Month? Here is some information from the OutCenter of Southwest Michigan which is celebrating their 20th anniversary in October:

> *LGBTQ*+ *history* is so incredibly important. For generations queer people were forced to stay in the shadows, their identity left to the margins of their story. A significant portion of the work to reassemble LGBTQ+ history is attempting to decode subtext and understand implications. Even modern history is plagued by self-censoring, editorialization, and systemic attempts at erasure. So many queer stories have gone untold, from ancient history to the aids epidemic to now. That is why it is so important for us to celebrate, record, and protect LGBTQ+ history.

Public Policy

The 198 attendees who attended the AAUW-SH candidate forum listened to South Haven mayoral and ward candidates introduce themselves and answer questions on issues of public interest at Listiak Auditorium on September 28. The forum was organized by your Public Policy Committee and moderated by PPC co-chair **Pat Stephenson.** Our AAUW of South Haven has been sponsoring candidate forums for over forty years and PPC regards the forum as one of our primary responsibilities.



PPC also sent a Rapid Responder Alert to our membership regarding Michigan House Bills 4129



and 4130 introduced in our state legislature that make it a felony to intimidate a clerk or poll worker, or otherwise prevent them from performing their duties. If you haven't already contacted your state legislators to support these bills, please refer to

Attendance approached 200 and was a successful precursor to the upcoming 2024 National/State/Local elections.

Our social calendar continued with the annual New Member Event at Cogdal Winery. The weather looked grim with rain all day, but stopped in time for our celebrations with a sky full of beautiful October sun and autumn clouds. We had a great turnout including many new members and potential members who were able to learn about the many activities we offer. Thank you to Jackie McAninch, Mary Ellen Doty, Darlene Buresch-Zoellick, and all others who helped setting up and cleaning up a fun time. Thanks also to Cogdal Winery for again hosting us.

I will miss the Domestic Violence Prevention committee's luncheon and speaker, but I know it will be delicious and informative.

Some of you know that I have been struggling with finishing our by-laws. Each time I thought it was complete there would be a typo or an addition from National or AAUW MI. With everyone's help I finally completed and submitted them to State for final proofing and found out today that our bylaws (with our permission) are being used as the model for all the other Michigan affiliates. We have both incorporated the National mandated section as well drafting what was referred to as "very good (local affiliate) bylaws". Our established tradition of support for Sylvia's Place, the work they do and the women they serve, is worth noting. Through the efforts of the Domestic Violence Prevention Committee (donated kitchen table, patio table and chairs, improved playroom equipment as well as improving the playground and outdoor areas) we have made a difference in the lives of the many women and families in residence. Through the generosity of our organization's members' (food baskets, personal care baskets, gas cards and PILLOWS), we have supported the complicated journey of countless domestic violence survivors, in a wide variety of practical ways.

The vision statement of AAUW SH reads WOMEN EMPOWERING WOMEN AND GIRLS and through your generosity we put our words into actions.




